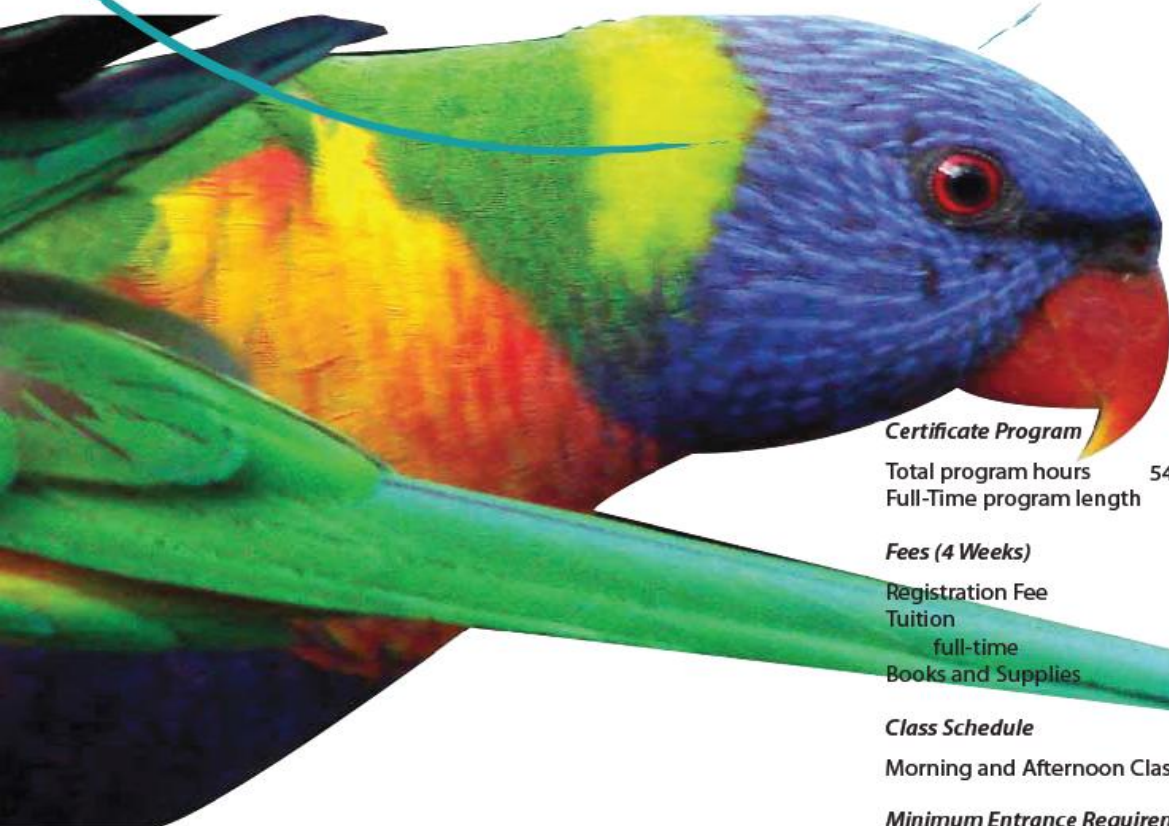

Pera College's exciting ESL Program helps students understand the complexities of language in a vibrant, interesting environment. At Pera, we aspire to not only teach the students precise grammar, clear pronunciation, and a comprehensive vocabulary but also give them the knowledge and confidence to use this ability in real, everyday situations. We strive to bring the language off the page and into the student's life, using authentic circumstances and ideas in the classroom to create a stimulating learning atmosphere.

Our qualified instructors use individual attention, pair work and small groups to monitor each student and help them according to their weaknesses, be that grammar, pronunciation or listening. Other classes are more conversation-based, using current media and texts to highlight the slang, idioms and expressions that make English so colourful and alive.

## Program Contents

### *English Structure + Syntax*

This is the time when students work on the fundamentals of English, with grammar being the foundation upon which to build. The essentials of English structure and syntax are explored through exciting topics utilizing our wide range of respected ESL textbooks and other communication media.

### *Communication / Power Speaking*

This lively, conversation-based class is a time for students to voice their opinions on important and relevant topics that interest them, while practicing and utilizing their new grammar and vocabulary. Discussions are formed to enhance their knowledge of slang, idioms and popular expressions, using current, popular material as topics. English doesn't only live in the classroom however, and this is often the time when field trips outside the school are taken to practice in real-life situations and settings.

### *Reading / Voc. Development*

The English vocabulary, on reading development activities and resources in this and related sites are based primarily elements that are included in thousands of English terms and expressions. It is advantageous for students to learn more about English development, as well as stories, redundancies, and other related terms that are provided to them with this focusing on words program.

### *Listening Development*

This course requires active participation. The aim is to equip you to understand your own listening attitudes and behavior, grounded from substantive knowledge. Initial emphasis is placed on the historical development of listening theory and supporting research. The major emphasis will be placed on foundational literature on listening. Also, you will become more aware of your own listening behaviour through selfexamination and exploration.

### *Writing Development*

Writing development classes in political journal writing combine instruction in the subjects of the course with exercises specifically designed to improve students' abilities to write academically. Generally, writing development classes have more demanding writing assignments than regular ESL classes. Writing development classes stress the need for correct grammar, spelling, and punctuation and encourage stylistic elegance.

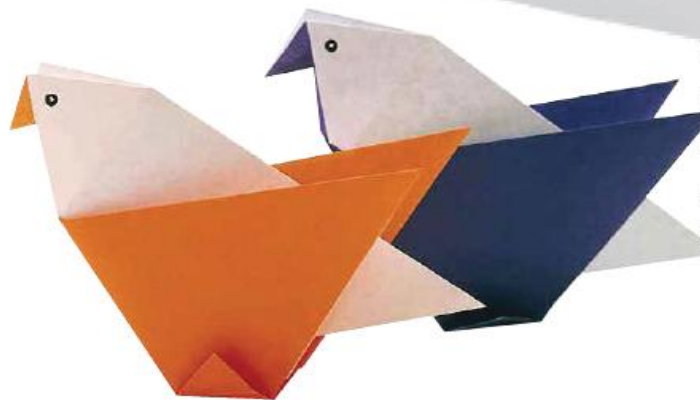

The Academic English program is a full-time IELTS test preparation course for students at intermediate level or above. A specific IELTS (International English Language Testing System) score is now required by many Canadian universities and immigration requirement as a qualification for entry into a formal program. It is a comprehensive test of English language proficiency designed to assess the ability of non-native speakers. It is highly recommended for those who need to use English in an Academic or immigration to Canada.

IELTS exams are held every four weeks in SFU, downtown or Burnaby. The module scores are added together to provide an overall Band Score. Band Scores range from 1 (non user) to 9 (expert user). This program thoroughly and systematically prepares the student for all aspects of the IELTS examination – reading, writing, listening and speaking.

An IELTS trial exam will be held every 4 weeks by Pera College in order to check the learner's improvements

## Program Contents

### Reading

The IELTS Reading task uses some ten question types, any of which may appear on the Reading test you take. In IELTS the hardest of all are the questions that ask you to identify the writer's point of view because the answer does not appear directly in the reading passage. The learner has to understand what the author says well enough to understand what he does not say, but implies, as well. PERA will train students to keep focused on the main points to get the full meaning from reading passages.

### Listening

The IELTS Listening test comes first, and many learners find it a hard, sometime even discouraging, way to get started. The IELTS Listening task tests a diverse range of skills. There are many ways to prepare for this portion of the IELTS exam. There are many practice tapes and CD sets on the market. While all of them are helpful to some degree, the one thing you can be sure of is that none of them will be the same as IELTS listening test you take. In the Pera College classroom all students will practice listening carefully then show how much they understand, in writing.

### Writing

The IELTS essay has always 3 types:

- The Opinion Essay, which asks your opinion on a topic.
- The Discussion Essay, which asks you to describe the pros and cons of a topic without saying which you agree with.
- The Explanatory, or Explanation Essay, which asks for your ideas, not opinions.

IELTS has three main question types that require an Opinion Essay as the "answer." Pera always gives the sample of answers and tips on how to write strong concise answers.

### Speaking

One of the main thing the IELTS Speaking task tests is a candidate's "fluency," which does not mean the ability to speak like a native-speaker but simply to speak "flowingly," that is, without long pauses.

The test requires that if a candidate stops speaking for more than 10 seconds at any point during the task, the penalty could be the loss of a band point. PERA will train students keep speaking without any pauses but make it clear that the learner has finished answering any question in the task.

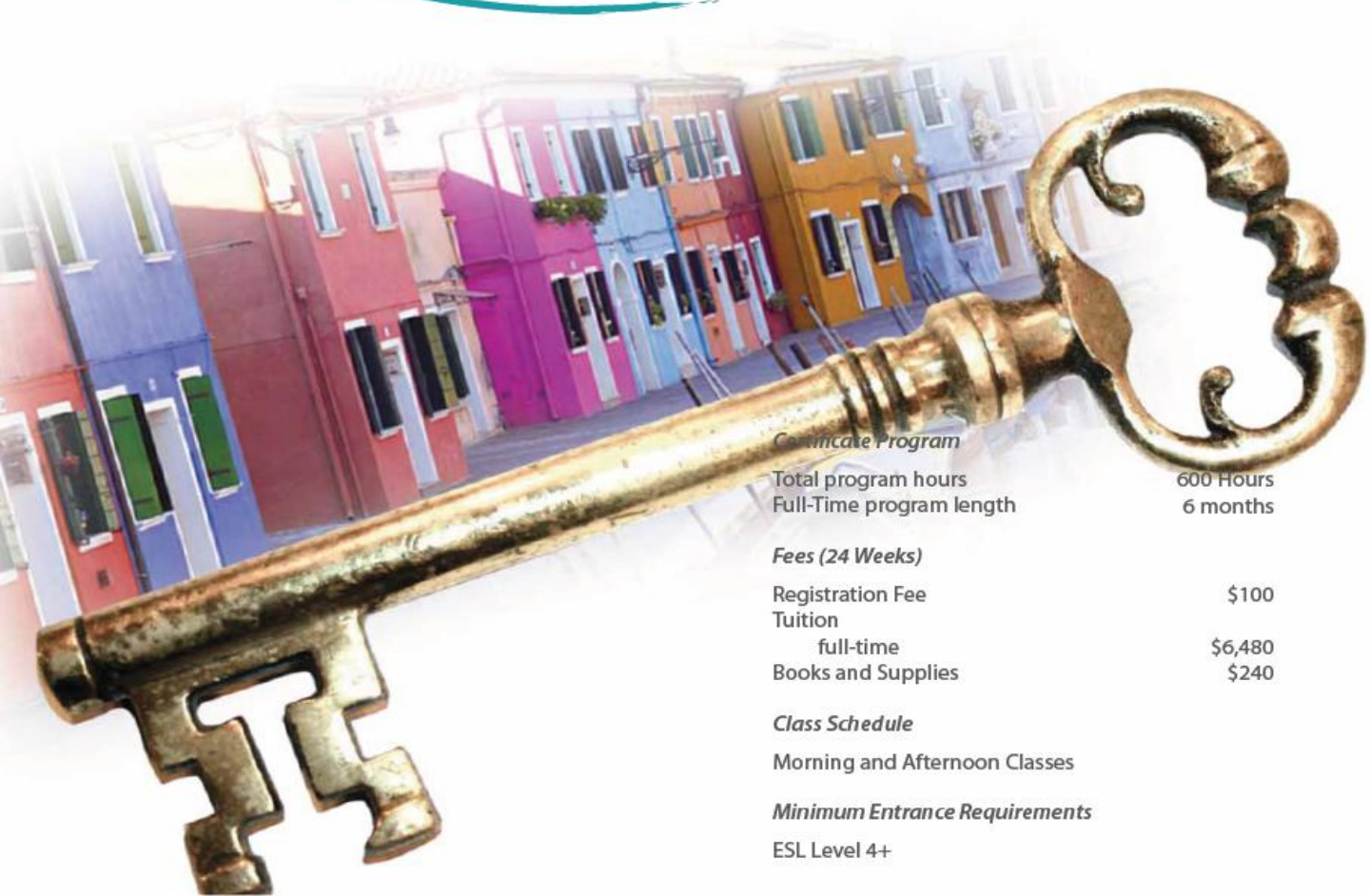

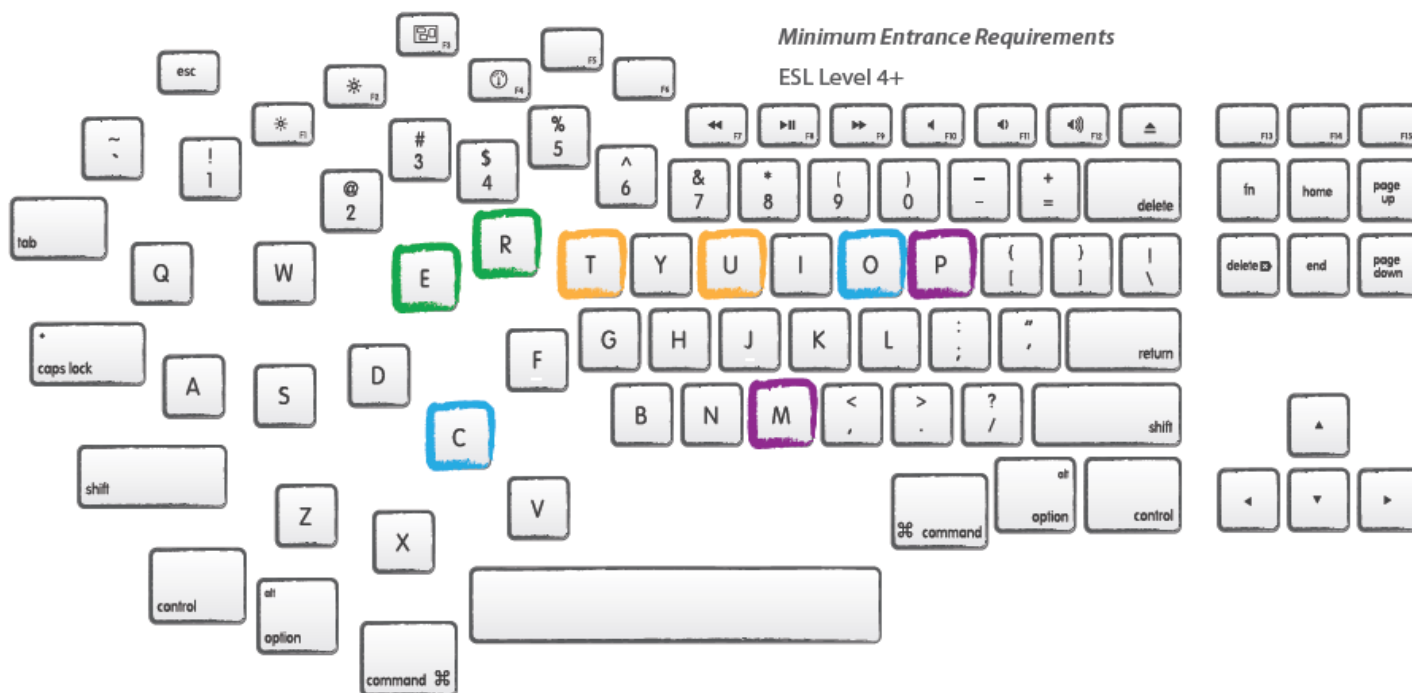

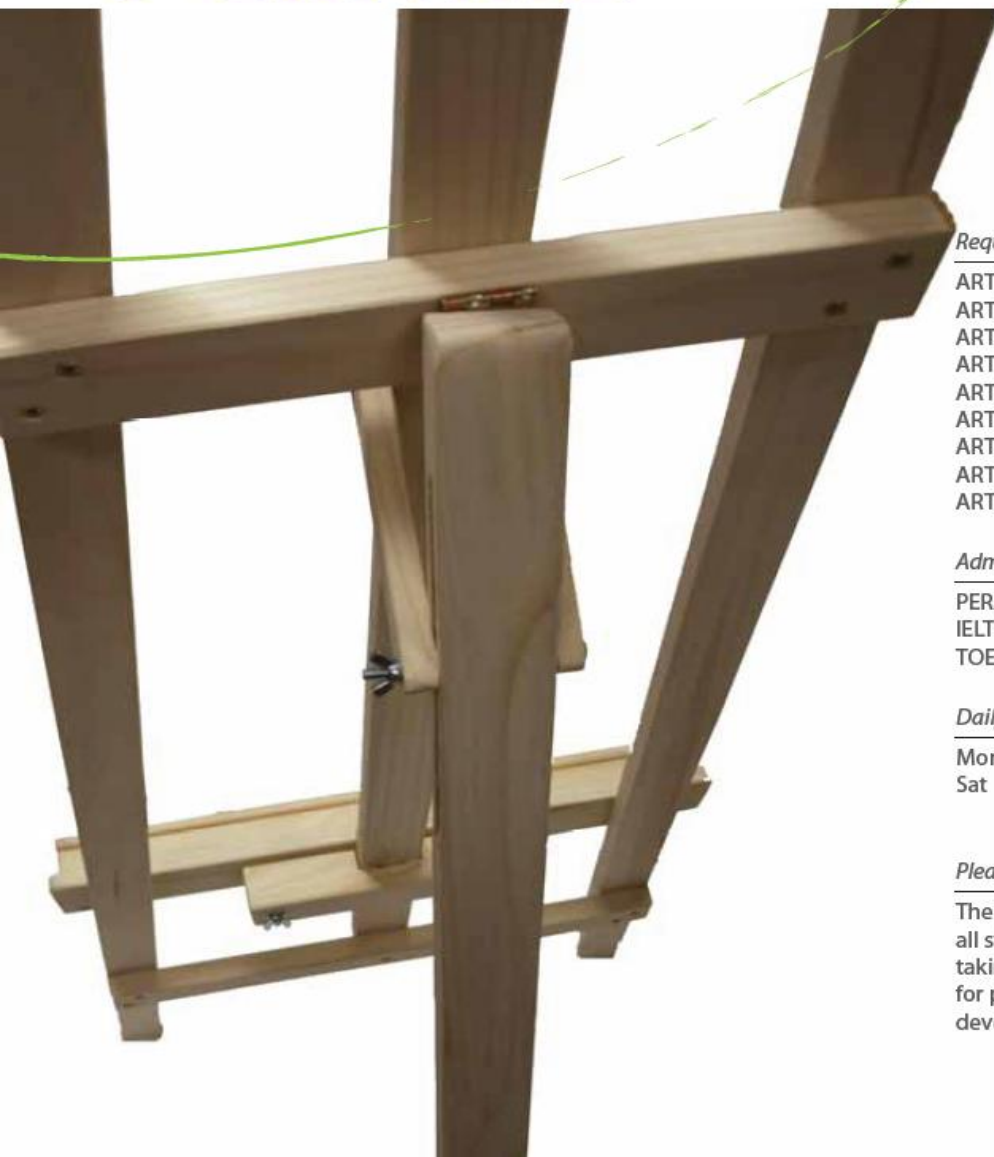

The Fine Arts Program provides an introduction to the fundamentals of fine arts as a vehicle for creative self expression. ### **ART111 - Advanced Photography**

This course provides how to use your camera in ways you never expected, creating images that break the boundaries of the very idea of the photographic images.

### **ART192 - Experimental Photography**

This course will introduce you to a unique and colorful art form which can be applied to any photographic practice both practical and artistic such as fashion photography, editorial, advertisements and even wedding photography.

### **ART193 - Digital Imaging 1**

This course is designed to introduce students to the fundamental concepts, terminology, techniques and applications of digital imaging.

### **ART141 - Photography Workshop**

Photographing in a studio allows you to control and manipulate light and perspective in ways that create arresting imagery.

### **ART194 - Digital Imaging**

In this course students will learn to use the computer and the photographic image management software application.

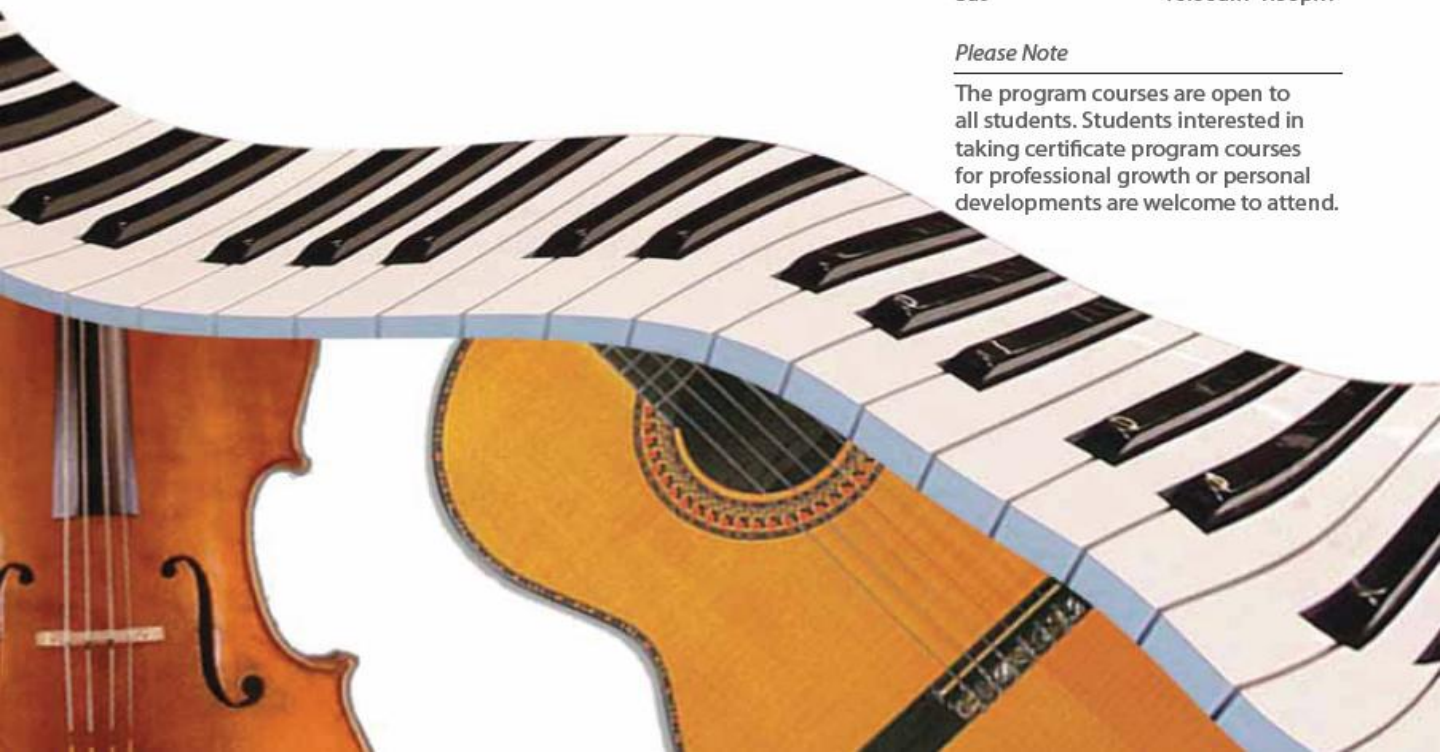

### *Music 113 - Music Theory & Solfege III*

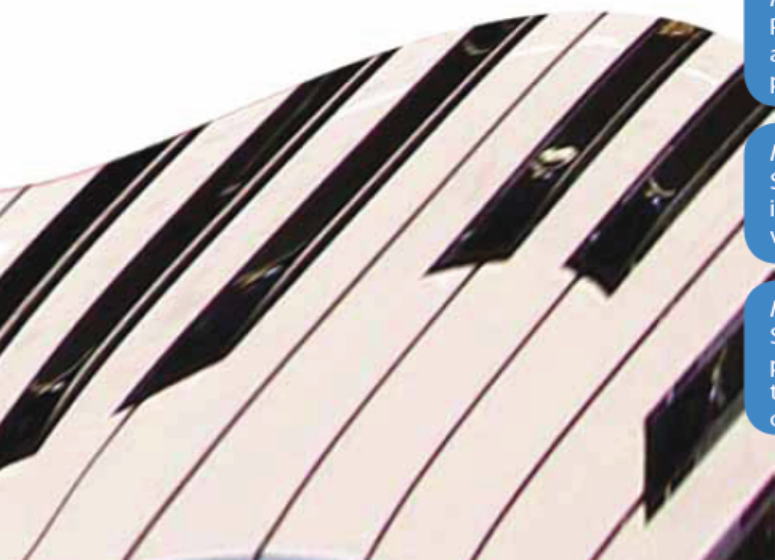
Prepare yourself for future musical endeavor and gain a professional command of the mechanics of contemporary music in this advanced music theory course.
